### **Around the table**

**Megan:** The City of Binghamton is experiencing a surge in covid cases. BU had 78 cases last week, so was anticipating having to shut down for 2 weeks (they moved to remote instruction Oct. 8). They have not had any layoffs yet, but hiring was frozen. There will be 2 positions opening up soon, however.

**Brian:** Some of their libraries are appointment only; some are open with restricted hours. The books are under quarantine for 7 days. They have had to cut back on databases.

**Lauren:** At SUNY Cortland they reached the 100 cases threshold and were moving to remote instruction as of Oct. 7. They have not had any layoffs, but have a reduced budget.

**Amanda:** They have 800 students on campus and 9 covid cases. They are short staffed and will be reviewing subscriptions to say where they can save on the budget. SUNYLA 2021 is supposed to be held at Delhi, so they are deciding whether to do a hybrid conference or all virtual.

**Camille:** Cornell had a spike, but it's now under control with only 4 active cases. The library is offering contactless pickup. They are open for classes at Mann, and offer study sessions by appointment. They have not had many layoffs and will be hiring a Law Librarian.

### **Recent events review**

We had 3 online workshops since the last meeting, as well as an online book discussion and we co-hosted the annual Resource Sharing User Group Meeting. The MarcEdit workshop had 51 attendees. The online book discussion had 15 participants initially and ended with 8. The Academic Libraries program had 91 register and about half attended. We got to use Bryan Alexander's online platform, Shindig. The CDL program had 104 attendees and very positive feedback. The Resource Sharing workshop had 80 attendees, with 16 attending from the SCRLC region.
