We welcomed Abby Juda from Ithaca College to the committee.

Updates

Lauren: They have a tech services position and a Library Assistant position open. She is on a SUNYLA I.L. committee and a working group that is addressing Al literacy in library instruction. She is also part of an Al fellows group that looks into Al resources. Microsoft 365 Copilot is available across all SUNYs.

Megan: SUNY Binghamton is piloting the 4C framework for AI. They have had to update their library chat feature so that students know that they are talking with a human, not AI. They are doing a hiring push in anticipation of a hiring freeze. They have two new AUL's and it's going well so far. She will be taking a sabbatical starting in July next year. She put in a proposal for a book, along with other professors on "ungrading," an alternative to student assessment with the standard grading system. She has been looking at the NYS Portrait of a Graduate.

Abby: Laura Kuo is their new director. They have no current job openings and lost 2 positions, plus Laura is no longer doing instruction, so they've had to reconceptualize their teaching team. All has also been a focus for them as well.

Educational Services Advisory Committee Goals

We reviewed the goals for the upcoming fiscal year. One change will be that we no longer do a biennial education needs assessment because the state now requires an annual membership needs assessment. So this committee will contribute to the annual assessment instead.

POS

We talked about how the continuing education environment has changed over the last few years since that will need to be addressed for the next POS (so many more webinars available; most are free; people can't get away as easily; they are more distracted; webinars are more interactive). We reviewed the previous POS goals and felt that they still applied. The current goal that mentions being responsive to change could address AI in a very general way- "flexible to adapting to emerging technologies. One additional goal would be to bring together library staff from different library types to address challenges. We could ask members "What is something your library wants?" and form interest groups around that. Focus on regional speakers.
