Amanda C.- SUNY Delhi's Provost is leaving after 3 semesters and a search committee has been formed to find a replacement.

Camille- The makerspace is now open M-Th, 2pm-7pm. There has been more interest than they even anticipated. 3-D printing and button making have been popular, among other activities. The Shipping container "portal" is being tested this week, with connections to Afghanistan & Mexico City and it will return for 3 months (August-November) in the lobby of the Biotech building and will be open to the public. They have

an opening for another Diversity Fellowship position.

Kelly- There are five open positions within Cornell University Libraries from entry-level to Associate University Librarian. The Dean of the Business School abruptly resigned and an interim has taken over. They are looking into migrating their CMS from Blackboard to another product.

Brian- The most recent libraries to come online were Andes, Bright Hill Press and Unadilla. They have seven more libraries to go. The website was updated, but the members did not like the new site and prefer the old one.

Eric- The TC3 Provost retired. They are in the midst of Midterms.

Pam- The Electronic Resources position at IC is still open, but they are in the process of reviewing candidates. One of the content specialty librarians will be retiring.
