No one filled this out. The committee suggested that people were put off by the term "experts," so it will be removed and we will continue to promote this.

Educational Services Survey 2018- <u>Results are in!</u> (Judith Andrew from IC won the raffle.)

We compared the 2018 results with the 2016 results and looked at the survey in depth. 150 filled it out in 2016, versus 81 in 2018. Last time it was majority public, this time it was majority academic, so that is something to bear in mind. GST BOCES members are not aware they are members of SCRLC. Based on years of experience, there are some newer people in the field this time around. The majority of people attend 1-5 workshops/webinars a year and some have a set budget so they are very particular about what they attend. People prefer webinars to be free. People have a greater preference for in –person workshops now than in 2016 although webinars are still popular. We talked about how many people quit Facebook in the last month since this survey went out. A program on social media and privacy was suggested by committee members. People are interested in pre and post session reading and we will work on incorporating this into our workshops and webinars. We discussed some of the event suggestions, but will look at this more at the next meeting. Library Futures was the most requested topic. Community Outreach was also something that came up in the suggestions that doesn't fall under other categories.

June- Health & Wellness:

We talked about doing a first aid for librarians workshop July- Library Spaces & Sustainability:

We talked about space redesign and maybe putting together a panel to include academic, public, school librarians and historical societies.

August- Digitization:

I will pass along survey results to our Digital Services Librarian to review and help plan the August program.

Amanda C.- SUNY Delhi's Provost decided to return after announcing departure. The library is having windows replaced, so the stacks will need to be moved for the project.

Camille- Cornell is going to hire an Associate University Librarian whose focus may be on Public Services and Diversity, Equity and Inclusion. Cornell has a few other positions open as well.

Jenny- Finger Lakes is looking for a Member Services Librarian who will focus more on policy development and less on youth services.

Brian- Endicott and BCPL are both looking for Directors. Vestal is looking for a Youth Services Librarian. Gilbertsville is the next library to come online (5/8). There are 11 libraries left that need to come online, although some are already partially online. Canon Library is will soon be having a centennial celebration.

Pam (via email)- "Our social sciences librarian, John Henderson, is retiring. We are also almost ready to name a new Electronic and Technical Services Librarian. Our new college president has been here almost a year and has announced some new staff at the VP level. Commencement weekend is the 18-20."
