August: Library Spaces & Sustainability

The survey pointed towards doing a program on small spaces, small budgets. The public libraries also talked about the state construction funding and doing a webinar that covers this whole process (applications are due in July, though, so timing may be off) Camille mentioned a WebJunction grant for small spaces.

September: Marketing & Communications

We also have a Resource Sharing Conference, a Legislative Breakfast, and a Digitization Working Group workshop planned for September. The survey seemed to point to people being interested in marketing to specific groups. I will look for a speaker who could discuss tailoring our messaging towards different groups. Jenny has also suggested someone who spoke at PLA about guerilla marketing.

4. Educational Services Plan

We reviewed a rough draft of the plan and its elements. I will send out a more polished draft sometime in August, so there will be plenty of time for comments and suggestions to review at our September meeting.

5. Around the table:

Amanda- SUNY Delhi is replacing their windows and moved all the books/stacks in May. They are also replacing doors in the library. With money from the state, they are transitioning half of their resources to OER's. They are working toward the SUNY migration to Alma and will go live next summer.

Camille- The new Associate University Librarian will begin August 1st. They still have several open positions including a Director for the Kheel Center, but are about to hire the new diversity fellow. They are also undergoing construction on their front entrance. And they are looking forward to receiving the shipping container portal which will open mid-August.

Jenny- The new Member Services Librarian will start on July 23rd and the member libraries are all gearing up for summer reading.

Brian- 4CLS has new directors in Endicott and Morris. Delhi and BCPL are still looking for new directors. Their members are also all focused on summer reading.

Pam- Terry Ann Coronel is their new E-resources Librarian. And they have narrowed down finalists for the Instructional Design Librarian.

Julia- They have a new Instructional Outreach Librarian and have filled several other new positions and now are on a "hiring pause."
